

Standard Response Protocol for Parents

STUDENT SAFETY and the STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL

Midland ISD has adopted the Standard Response Protocol (SRP) and entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the "I Love U Guys" Foundation for use of the SRP. The Standard Response Protocol is a uniform response to any incident and has been recommended by the Texas School Safety Center, the organization tasked with supporting key school safety initiatives and mandates for the State of Texas and the Governor's Homeland Security Strategic Plan. Area first responders are familiar with the SRP.

SRP and TRAINING

We encourage parents to become familiar with the actions here and reinforce the protocol with students. In the event of an emergency, the action and appropriate direction will be called on the PA. Students and staff will be trained on the SRP and other safety procedures, and the school will drill these actions throughout the school year.

LOCKOUT



LOCKOUT! SECURE THE PERIMETER. Lockout is called when there is a threat or hazard outside of the school building.

TEACHER

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock perimeter doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Business as usual
- Take attendance

STUDENTS

- Return inside
- Business as usual

LOCKDOWN



LOCKDOWN! LOCKS, LIGHTS, OUT OF SIGHT. Lockdown is called when there is a threat or hazard inside the school building.

TEACHER

- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move out of sight
- Maintain silence
- Take attendance
- Wait for first responders to open the door

STUDENTS

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- No cellphones (lights identify targets)
- Do not open the door

EVACUATE



EVACUATE! EVACUATE TO A SPECIFIC POSITION. Evacuate is called to move students and staff from one location to another.

TEACHER

- Take roll sheet if possible
- Lead students to Evacuation Location
- Take attendance

STUDENTS

- Bring your phone
- Leave your stuff behind
- Form a single line
- Show your hands
- Follow instructions

SHELTER



SHELTER! EVACUATE TO SHELTER AREA. Shelter is called when the need for personal protection is necessary.

TORNADO or HAZMAT

TEACHER

- Use appropriate hazard and safety strategies
- Take attendance

STUDENTS

- Shelter in designated location
- Follow instructions

HOLD



HOLD! HOLD IN YOUR CLASSROOM. Hold is called when the hallways need to be kept clear, even during class changes.

TEACHER

- Remain in the classroom
- Rapidly sweep the hallway for nearby students
- Take attendance

STUDENTS

- Remain in the classroom
- Follow instructions
