

**District 2-6A
Policy Book
2016-2018**

SECTION 100: DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

100.1 The District shall be composed of (6) AAAAAA schools as designated by the University Interscholastic League. The Schools that will make up the District are Amarillo Tascosa, Frenship, Midland High and Midland Lee, Odessa High and Odessa Permian, and San Angelo Central. San Angelo Central will not compete in Basketball, Soccer, Softball and Baseball in 2-6A. Those sports will compete in District 8-6A

100.2 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

100.21 The executive Committee shall be composed of the High School Principals or their designated administrators from the participating schools. There will be 7 voting members. San Angelo will not vote if Baseball, Softball, Basketball and Soccer are involved.

100.22 Each participating school shall have one vote.

100.3. DISTRICT CHAIRMAN

100.31 The District Executive Committee of District 2-6A shall select a chairman to serve for the first two school years of the realigned District 2-6A. The District Chairman shall serve two years or until the current 7 team district is dissolved by the UIL. The District Chairman shall be replaced if the majority of the members vote to vacate the position. The District Executive Committee and the District Chairman shall govern all Interscholastic League inter-school activities.

100.32 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DISTRICT CHAIRMAN

1. Call all regular, special and emergency meetings of the District Executive Committee.
2. Be responsible for all funds collected by the District Executive Committee and issue all checks.
3. Be responsible for the purchase of all awards for all district contests as directed by the District Executive Committee.
4. Collect and make all assessments to cover the expenses of the District Executive Committee.
5. Issue District Passes.
6. Approve all transfers when correct UIL transfer forms are properly completed according to UIL C&CR regulations.
7. Report all penalties to the UIL office.
8. Certify to the UIL, the District 2-6A play-off representatives in each area of competition as it occurs and in accordance with the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.
9. Preserve and maintain the records of the District Executive Committee.
10. Prepare and distribute minutes of each meeting and district policy amendments in a timely manner.
11. Appoint committees and make studies and recommendations as deemed necessary.
12. Be familiar with the duties of the District Executive Committee, as prescribed in the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.

100.33 The District Chairman is a non-voting member of the District Executive Committee.

100.4 MEETINGS

100.41 There shall be two (2) District Executive Committee meetings with the time and place designated by the District Chairman. One will be held prior to the start of school in August the second will be held in February depending on Realignment. **Special Meetings may be called if needed. All meetings will be held in Wolfforth, Texas at Frenship ISD.**

100.42 An agenda will be sent to district members two weeks prior to the meetings. No action can be taken on items not so listed without the unanimous approval of the District Executive Committee.

100.43 All other meetings shall be called by the District Chairman by notifying all member schools.

100.44 Meetings are to be open meetings. Any member of the committee may ask for an executive session at any time.

100.45 **All District 2-6A District Executive Committee Meetings will be held in Wolfforth, Texas at the Frenship ISD Administration Building.**

100.5 FEES

100.51 The District operational fee will be assessed as needed. District fees for **2016-2018 will be \$6,500 for each of the seven schools and \$2,000 for any magnet school that wishes to compete in the 2-6A Academic Meet.** The District Chairman fees will be \$2,500 per school. If any Magnet Schools or schools outside of District 2-6A petition the District Executive Committee to compete in the Academic Meet their District Fees will be \$2,000.

100.52 District Dues are to be paid by no later than **October 1, 2016.** Fees will be sent to Mrs. Cynthia Halamicek in care of San Angelo Central High School, 655 Caddo, San Angelo Texas 76901.

SECTION 200: SPORTSMANSHIP

200.1 In an effort to promote and encourage sportsmanship, a most important ingredient of scholastic competition, the District Executive Committee has adopted the Sportsmanship Code and the Sportsmanship Awards.

200.12 SPORTSMANSHIP CODE

200.13 Let us resolve that we, the member schools of District 2-6A, will be united in our efforts to promote good sportsmanship. In all Interscholastic League contest our purpose is to promote better relationships among students and adult fans, and to promote friendly rivalry between the schools in the District.

200.14 We will cooperate with each other by observing both the University Interscholastic League rules and local rules for the conduct of each contest.

200.15 We will practice fair play in both reality, spirit, and according to the rules as interpreted by the officials.

200.16 We will practice the golden rule: “do unto others as you would have them do unto you”. We will treat our opponents as guests and friends by providing information for their comfort and welfare.

200.17 We will maintain a courteous attitude at all times during and after all interschool activities. We will respect the rights of others, the officials, the school song, the national anthem, and the prayer or “moment of silence” when they are used for a contest.

200.2 ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

200.21 All varsity athletes with a 90 average or equivalent will be designated as members of District 2-6A All District Academic Team. The cumulative GPA at the end of the most recent semester will be used for students in grades 10-12. Freshmen students will be evaluated based on the cumulative GPA after the most recent grading period.

200.22 Principals will determine what athletes meet the guideline and will issue District 2-6A Certificates to these individuals at the end of the year.

200.23 Each School will be responsible for filling out the certificates and issuing the certificates to the athletes.

200.3 SPECIAL EVENTS PRIOR TO ANY CONTEST

200.31 SPECIAL EVENTS PRIOR TO District Athletic Contest. (All Sports)
“Special Events such as Parents Night, Senior Night or Recognition of Middle School Athletes” should not change the starting time of games and should not interfere with the warm up time of the opposing teams.

SECTION 300 2-6A FOOTBALL

300.1 SCHEDULE

300.11 The District Executive Committee will adopt the football schedule for a two year period.

300.12 A Junior Varsity schedule will be played with the Junior Varsity teams playing the same week as the varsity teams and opposite the varsity site.

300.13 A District Champion will not be declared in Junior Varsity Football.

300.14 All District Varsity football games that shall be played on Thursdays will be at 7:00 pm. Friday games will be played at 7:30 pm depending on availability of a stadium and if there is a double header scheduled on Friday the first game will be played at 4:00 pm and the second game will be scheduled at 8:00 pm. Saturday game times will be determined by the Athletic Directors of the schools that will be playing.

300.15 In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. **Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee.** All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approved by the District Athletic Directors. **Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches.** (Games that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date). Sub-Varsity games will not be made up unless mutually agreed upon by both schools.

300.2 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

300.21 The team with the best won/lost record in District play will be the District Champion. The team with the second, third, and fourth best won/lost record in district play shall represent the district in the playoffs. If two or more teams are tied for the district championship, the teams involved in the tie shall be declared co-champions.

300.22 DETERMINING PLAYOFF REPRESENTATIVES

300.23 Determine the top four teams. Place the two largest of the four in the Division I bracket and place the remaining two schools in the Division II bracket according to the order of finish of these two schools

300.24 In the event of ties, the following tie breaking procedure will be used.

TWO TEAM TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

- (1) Head-to-head

MULTIPLE TEAM TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

- (1) Head-to-head
- (2) Positive and Negative Points

The multiple tie breaking procedures will be used only to determine the four playoff representatives. Once the top four teams are identified, the largest two schools will be placed in the Division I bracket and the two smaller teams will be placed into Division II bracket. The two team tie breaker procedure will be used for placement in the playoff brackets.

If 4 or more teams tie for first place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine the four playoff representatives:

or

If 4 or more teams tie for 2nd place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place representatives:

or

If 3 or more teams tie for 3rd place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine the 3rd and 4th place playoff representatives:

or

If 3 or more teams tie for 4th place in the district race the following procedure will be used to determine the 4th place playoff representative:

1. Head-to-Head: If one team has beaten all the teams involved in the tie, that team shall advance. If only two teams remain tied, head-to-head results shall prevail. If a multiple team tie still remains, the multiple team tie breaking procedure will be used considering only the teams remaining tied. Once multiple teams have entered into the positive/negative point tie breaking system, they will remain in the system until all places are settled or unbreakable points are established. (The teams will not revert back to head-to-head once one team has been placed and two remain. The point system will still be used.)
2. Positive and Negative Points: In a multiple team tie that cannot be determined by head-to-head competition the positive/negative point system will be used. In a multiple tie of 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place, representatives will be determined by positive and negative points.
3. If there is an unbreakable tie in points among multiple teams, the tie will be broken by a coin toss with the odd man in. Once that one is selected, then the tie breaking system goes back to: (a) head-to-head, then (b) positive/negative points and (c) coin toss.

POINT SYSTEM (Positive and Negative Points)

Points are relative only to the teams tied. The tied teams represent a mini-district and points are taken only from games played within that mini-district.

A team may gain a maximum of 15 points per game (0 to 15).

A team may lose a maximum of 15 points per game (0 to 15).

Scenarios:

Four way tie (two loses - two teams must have lost at least one game outside the mini-district):

Team A – beat Team B +7, loses Team C -4, beat Team D +15

Team B – loses Team A -7, beat Team C +4, loses Team D -15

Team C – beat Team A +4, loses Team B -4, beat Team D +12

Team D – loses Team A -15, beat Team B +1, loses Team C -2

Point Totals:

Team A: +7, -4, +12 = +15	First	Small School Enrollment
Team B: -7, +4, -12 = -15	Fourth	Large School Enrollment
Team C: +4, -4, +12 = +12	Second	Large School Enrollment
Team D: -12, +1, -2 = -13	Third	Small School Enrollment

1st and 2nd seed for Small School Enrollment determined by head-to-head of 2 Small Enrollment schools, and the same procedure used to 2 Large School Enrollment schools.

The following scenario would be used to determine the playoff representative in the event of a tie that involves the exact number of play-off positions available:

4 way tie for first: Two largest schools in Division I and the two smallest schools in Division II. Head-to-head would be used to determine division seeding.

3 way tie for 2nd: If the 1st place representative is a large school, then the second seed in Division I goes to the next largest school. The two remaining schools will be in Division II. Head-to-head will determine the seeding in Division II.

2 way tie for 3rd: The 1st and 2nd place representatives will determine the seeding of the two remaining schools. EX: If the 1st and 2nd place teams are Division I, then the 2 tied teams will be in Division II and head-to-head determines seeding.

300.3 OFFICIAL FOOTBALL

300.31 The ball must be in compliance with “The National Collegiate Athletic Association Football Rules”.

300.4 ELIGIBILITY

300.41 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the District Chairman and post one copy at their school prior to playing its first Contest.

300.42 Supplementary eligibility lists shall be submitted to the District Chairman and a copy will also be posted at their school as players are added to the team.

300.43 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

300.44 Eligibility Cases: Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

300.45 The District will adhere to the UIL Transfer Rule with eligibility approved depending upon the filing of signed release forms with the District Chairman.

300.5 ADMISSION POLICIES

300.51 TICKET PRICES

300.52 Each 2-6A School District may set the cost of their Season Tickets.

Reserve-seat ticket prices each week will be **\$8.00. (Only tickets for the game to be played that week can be sold. No tickets for future games will be on sale).**

Tickets sold at the gate on game night will be **\$10.00** each for both adults and students.

Student pre-game tickets will be \$3.00 each when bought at school. (Student Section)

Student tickets bought at the gate on game night will be **\$10.00**. (Student Section)

300.53 All sub-varsity (grades 9-12) ticket prices will be **\$3.00** for students and **\$5.00** for adults.

300.54 All middle school (grades 6-8) and elementary school (grades 1-5) ticket prices will be \$1.00 for students and \$2.00 for adults.

300.5 Revenue for all football games will be kept by the home team. Visiting teams will keep the revenue from ticket sales in their cities and a report will be sent to the home team.

300.6 PASSES

300.61 Football players, bands, cheerleaders, pep squad, and drill teams as organized school supervised groups, in uniforms, shall be admitted to District 3-6A games without a ticket.

300.62 The working press, radio men, game officials, coaches, and people who are working at the game (ushers, ticket sellers, ticket takers, those working in concessions, electricians, etc.) shall be admitted to District Football games without tickets. Adults that have been assigned to supervise students (band sponsors, cheerleader sponsors, bus drivers) will also be admitted free.

300.63 All complimentary tickets are to be paid for by the individual schools.

300.64. Tickets for visiting School. The District shall adhere to current UIL rules.

300.65 Sideline passes will be available by the home team for individuals that might be on the sideline during games, (photographers, band sponsors, team doctors etc.) Each school will be issued 20 passes and may request more if needed. These passes must be worn and be visible at all times.

300.7 DISTRICT PASSES

300.71 The District Chairman will issue a District 2-6A Pass (200 per School) to the Athletic Directors who intern will issue them to School Principals, Administrators and coaches.

300.72 District Passes will read "Bearer of Pass + one"

300.73 Each Head Coach will send two copies of the media guide/program and roster to all district opponents before the first district game. An updated roster will be e-mailed ten days prior with HUDL video exchange.

300.8 STADIUM POLICIES

300.81 Pre-game

- a. The playing field is to be kept cleared from one hour prior to the game for Player's to warm up.
- b. The following sequence of events for pre-game ceremonies is recommended. Prior to kickoff. The clock operator will start the game clock at 6:30 PM to count down 60 minutes to the 7:30 PM kickoff. The pre-game activities below are recommended.

Pregame activities concluded

7:00 -- UIL pre-game comments by game announcer

7:02 -- Exchange of gifts and other student activities (if any)

7:10 -- Visiting team school song

7:14 -- Home team school song

7:18 -- NATIONAL ANTHEM

7:23 -- Coin Toss

7:30 -- Kickoff

- c. It will be the responsibility of the Principal of the host school to see that the visiting school gets a pre-game agenda (if deviating from the pre-game ceremonies listed above) seating arrangements, stadium plan, and special arrangements no later than Tuesday of the week of of the game, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon.

300.82. HALF-TIME ACTIVITIES

- a. The half-time interval will be 28 minutes (UIL rule). The referee will notify both coaches at least four minutes before the start of the second half.
- b. Bands and pep squads must divide the time equally for half-time performance time. Each band has 13 minutes to enter, perform, and leave the field. The clock will start as soon as the field is cleared of the football teams. The timer will not wait until the band is ready to begin. The time for the second band and drill team will begin as soon as the band steps on the field or automatically one minute after the first band leaves the field. Band directors and drill teams will be warned if the maximum time limit is violated.
- c. It will be the responsibility of the principal of each school to see that each band director has a copy of the district operating procedures.

300.83 All violations of the half-time rule must be reported to the District Executive Committee.

300.84 Lines in the Stadium: No lines may be formed inside the stadium by students or adults prior to, during, or after the game except those in uniform.

300.85 Students on the Field: No students or adults shall be permitted on the playing field prior to, during, or after the game except those in uniform, engaged in the game and half-time activities.

300.86 Mascots: No live mascots will be permitted at football games.

300.87 Signs: Durable signs of a positive nature may be displayed at District football games with approval of the game administrator. No paper signs or hand held signs will be allowed. Durable signs must not be mounted with tape of any kind.

300.88 Noisemakers: Air horns (any device that uses air to make a noise that would be a disruption to fellow spectators or to the athletes on the playing field), sirens and whistles are not permitted in the stadium.

300.89 No outside food or drinks will be allowed in the stadium.

300.9 VIDEO SPECIFICATIONS

300.91 All Schools will use HUDL.

300.92 All HUDL video will be sent ODKed and with down and distance displayed.

300.93 All Video will be e-mailed 10 days before the game. The video should be in the opponent's possession by 1:00 pm on Wednesday..

300.94 The one remaining HUDL exchange video will be e-mailed after both teams involved have played their opponent's that week.

300.100 ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

300.101 The head football coaches will meet in Wolfforth, Texas (Frenship ISD), the Wednesday following the final district game to select the official All-District Football Team. The District Chairman will set the time for the meeting and the District Champions will host the All-District Meeting. The meeting will be held at no cost to the District 2-6A Fund.

300.101 It is up to each head coach as to who he takes with him to the meeting.

300.200 TROPHY

300.201 The District Chairman will order the District Championship Trophy and it will be presented to the District Champions at the All District Meeting.

300.202 The District Championship Trophy will be paid for by the District 2-6A Fund

300.300 DISTRICT BELL

300.301 There will be no official District Bell. District Teams that wish to have a Team Bell may have it on the sideline during district games.

300.400 BROADCASTING

300.401 Radio

300.402 1. The Home school will make arrangements for the broadcast of its games by a local station. 2. Feeds will not be allowed to a neutral town.(Neutral town is one other than those involved in the game). 3. Should there be a feed to the visiting town, it must be only to the station or stations designated by the officials of the visiting school. 4. The visiting school shall designate one radio station to broadcast the game from the site of the game. 5. Radio broadcast crews shall be limited to a maximum of four (4) radio booth passes and one (1) side line pass. 6. If the local school makes a charge for the broadcast rights of the game, the local school shall retain the receipts. 7. Radio broadcast rights are granted under the conditions of the University Interscholastic League Broadcast Regulations.

300.403 Telecasting (live or delay)

300.404 1. Live telecasting of district football games will not be allowed unless the game is a sellout and with the mutual agreement on arrangements and fees by the two teams involved. 2. This is not intended to prohibit the telecasting of a film made up of the highlights of games at the end of the season or the showing of isolated shots or a game on a sports telecast. 3. Should a contract be made with a television station for the telecast of a game, all of the conditions of the "University Interscholastic League Broadcast Agreement" must be adhered to.

300.405 Weeknight athletic games, Thursday for football and Tuesday for other sports, can be telecast live if both teams mutually agree and if the revenue from that live telecast is split evenly.

300.500 OFFICIALS

300.501 Both Head Football coaches must agree on the officials for their respective games. Each Head Coach should be notified and officials agreed upon by May 31, 2016 and also 2017, prior to the football season. Each home school will use their home officials

300.504 All District 2-6A football games will be played with five officials on the field.

SECTION 400 2-6A BASKETBALL

400.1 ADMISSIONS

400.11 Adult Tickets shall be \$5.00

400.12 Student Tickets shall be \$3.00

400.13 Each Team shall retain the receipts from its home basketball games.

400.2 OFFICIALS

400.21 A three-man crew of officials will be used for all District 2-6A District Games

400.22 District 2-6A will use local chapters for all games.

400.23 Each District School, both men and women, will have the opportunity to scratch 10 officials as provided by the UIL

400.24 When the Chapter secretary makes changes, regardless of the reason, head coaches from each school must be notified.

400.25. Official scratches requested by district coaches of district games must be requested on the UIL website.

400.26 Officials will be paid according to the University Interscholastic League Schedule for basketball Officiating.

400.3 SCHEDULE

400.31 The District Executive Committee will adopt a double round robin schedule with home sites reversed for the second year. The schedule will allow time for playoff ties.

400.4 DAY AND TIME OF GAMES

400.41 District Basketball games will be played on **Tuesday, Fridays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approved by the Athletic Directors of the schools involved. Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches. (Games that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date). Varsity Girls will play the early game and the Varsity Boys will play the last game. After the Girls certification date the Boys will have two games remaining and game time will be 7:30 Pm.

400.42 TIMES OF GAMES

400.43 Game times for Sub-Varsity games will be at the discretion of the home team, with approval for the Athletic Director.

400.45. Varsity Girls' will start at 6:00 PM

Varsity Boys 'shall start at 7:30 PM or 20 minutes after the girls' game, whichever is later.

400.46 The Home team will wear White Jerseys, and the visiting team will wear Colored Jerseys.

400.47 For the purpose of rescheduling games that have been cancelled, games must be rescheduled for the next available playing date.

400.48 GAME TIMES FOR SATURDAYS (If Games need to be played on Saturday's)

Main Gym: 1:00 pm

400.49 GAME TIMES FOR SUB-VARSITY Games

All sub-varsity teams should play 8 minute quarters.

400.5 GAME BALL

400.51 The official basketball shall be an official top grade leather basketball. The District Basketball for boys is the Baden, Spaulding 100 or 1000, Wilson Jet or Wilson Competition. The home team will provide minimum or four warm-up basketballs for the visiting team. Girls will use the smaller basketball. The home team will determine the ball to be used.

400.6 TROPHY

400.61 The District Chairman will order the District Championship Trophy and it will be presented to the District Champions at the All District Meeting.

400.62 The District Championship Trophy will be paid for by the District 2-6A Fund

400.7 DISTRICT MEETING

400.71 Basketball coaches will meet the Wednesday after the UIL District certification date to select an All-District Team for 2-6A. The District Chairman will set the time and place for the All District Meeting. District Champion will host the meeting.

400.72 All District meetings will be held in Wolfforth, Texas. Frenship ISD. Coaches nominate their players, but cannot vote on their own players.

400.73 All District Selections and Superlatives: The following District Superlatives will be voted on by coaches at the All District Meeting.

1. Player of the Year
2. New Comer of the Year
3. Offensive Player of the Year
4. Defensive Player of the Year
5. 6th Man of the Year.

400.8 ELIGIBILITY

400.81 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest. A copy of the eligibility list will also be kept on file at the School.

400.82 Supplemental eligibility lists shall be submitted to the District Chairman as players are added to the team. A copy of the eligibility list will also be kept on file at the School.

400.83 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

400.84 Eligibility Cases: Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

400.85 The District will adhere to the UIL Transfer Rule with eligibility approved depending upon the filing of signed release forms with the District Chairman.

400.9 GYMASIUM POLICIES (Also will apply to Volleyball)

400.91 Signs in Gyms

400.92 No temporary signs or hand held signs shall be permitted in gyms for basketball games. Permanent spirit signs, positive in nature, will be allowed but tape cannot be used to attach the sign to any object.

400.93 Lines in Gyms

400.94 Victory lines can only be formed by players in uniform as teams come on to the court.

400.95 Mascots

400.96 No Live mascots will be permitted at Basketball games.

400.97 Noisemakers

400.98 Noisemakers are prohibited at league athletic conte4st in field houses and/or gymnasiums

400.99 Bands:

400.91.5 Home bands may play prior to game time, between games, during time outs, and at the half-time, but they are not to be seated directly behind the player benches, and the number of Band Members may not exceed twenty-five (25).

400.100 INSTANT REPLAY EQUIPMENT

400.101 Video tape equipment will be permitted at district games for filming purposes only.

400.102 No member school shall allow a video of the district representatives to be borrowed or viewed by another school until the district representatives have been eliminated or have won the State Championship.

400.103 Radio Broadcasts: (Same rule applies to basketball as in football).

400.104 Telecasting: (Same rule applies to basketball as to football). Telecast of basketball games on the local basis is permitted if the game is a complete sellout.

400.110 DETERMING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP (Will also apply to all other team sports)

400.111 The team having the highest percentage of district wins shall be declared District Champions. The team with the second highest percentage of district wins shall be the District runner-up. The team with the third highest percentage of district wins shall be the third place team. The team with the fourth highest percentage of district wins shall be the fourth place team. **(All ties will be decided by a coin toss and the winner of the toss will always take the higher seed.) The only play-in games that will be played will involve teams tied for the 4th place position where a team may need to be eliminated.**

400.112 Teams tied for first place at the end of regular season will be co-champions, tri-champs, etc. If two teams tie for first and if either team has beaten the other in both head to head games, then that team will receive the higher seed. **If the two teams split head to head the two teams will determine the seeding by a coin toss (with the winner of the flip being the higher seed).**

400.113 If two teams tie for second or third and if either team has beaten the other in both head to head games, then that team will receive the higher seed. **If the two teams split head to head the two teams will determine the seeding by a coin toss (with the winner of the flip being the higher seed).**

(No seeding games will be played. Seeding will always be determined by a coin flip) Winner of flips will always get the higher seed.

400.114 If two teams tie for fourth and if either team has beaten the other in both head to head games, then that team will be declared the winner and will be the fourth place seed. If two teams are tied for fourth and they have split their head to head games then the two teams shall have a one game play-in game and the winner shall be designated 4th place.

400.115 In the event of a multiple ties for any place, **and a team or teams must be eliminated leaving only four teams,** seeding will be determined by creating a mini district with the teams involved. Once the mini district is created then the following will be looked at: District records, and Head to Head. If that does not resolve the ties than a mini tournament will be held to decide the 4th place seed.

Scenario: 3 teams tied for first with 7-5 records

Team A 3-1 Team B 3-1 Team C 2-2 (Team C gets the third seed)

Team A and Team B may have a playoff to determine the #1 seed and the #2 seed.

3 teams tied for first with 7-5 records

Team A 2-2 Team B 2-2 Team C 2-2 (Head to head they all split)

Coin toss for first round bye and play it off.

4 Teams tied for second with 6-6 records

Team A 5-1 Team B 4-2 Team C 4-2 Team D 3-3

Team A receives the #2 seed (Best winning percentage within the group tied)

Team D is eliminated (Worst winning percentage with the group tied)

Team B and Team C may have a playoff to determine 3rd and 4th seeding

400.116 Playoff game sites shall be mutually agreed upon.

400.200 Cheerleaders will not be allowed behind the opponents bench or in the way along the Baseline.

400.300 **SPECIAL EVENTS PRIOR TO District Athletic Contest. (All Sports)**
“Special Events such as Parents Night, Senior Night or Recognition of Middle School Athletes” should not change the starting time of games and should not interfere with the warm up time of the opposing teams.

500.8 ELIGIBILITY

500.81 Rosters: Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the UIL office and District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest.

500.82 Supplemental eligibility lists shall be submitted to the UIL office and District Chairman as players are added to the team.

500.11 CANCELLED GAMES

500.111 Cancelled games will be played on the next available date.

500.12 SUSPENDED/TIED GAMES

500.121 If a game is tied or suspended the first round of district play, the game will pick up at the point of suspension and play will resume on the day of the 2nd round game versus the same opponent.

500.122 If a game is tied or suspended the second round of district play, the game will pick up at the point of suspension and play will resume the next available playing date

SECTION 600:

2-6A GOLF

600.1 SCHEDULE

600.11 The golf schedule shall consist of 36 holes of medal play to be played at Diamondback Golf Club in Abilene, Texas, a neutral site.

600.12 The Girls District round will be on Monday April 3 and Tuesday April 4,

600.13 The Boys District round will be on Monday April 10 and Tuesday April 11.

600.2 GOLF TEAMS

600.21 Each school in the District may enter two five (5) member golf teams in district golf meets. (2 girls teams and 2 boys teams).

600.22 In Addition, each school may enter up to three (3) individual medalists, for a maximum total of thirteen (13) players.

600.3 GOLF AWARDS

600.31 Five medals are given to each of the members of the top three teams.

600.32 A trophy is given to the top medalist and the runner-up.

600.33 A team trophy is given to the top team only for boys and girls.

600.34 The official medals are those agreed upon by the District Executive Committee.

600.35 All Golf Awards will be paid for by District 2-6A. Trophies are to be ordered from Athletic Supply in Odessa, Texas. Invoices will be sent to the District Chairman

600.4 DETERMINING THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

600.41 The District Champion shall be determined by the low total accumulative score as the result of the district medal play matches.

600.42 To determine medalist and runner-up, the District round in Abilene will be used.

600.43 If two teams or individuals tie, a sudden death hole by hole playoff shall immediately follow the conclusion of regular district play. (Team play will consist of 5 players from each school team that tied. All 5 players will play and the best 4 scores will be counted. The team that has the lowest score on the first playoff hole will be declared the District Champion and the loser will be Runner-Up). Both of these teams will represent District 2-6A at the Regional Tournament.

600.44 Individual play for District Medalist will be the same as team play with two individuals who tie for medalist participating in a sudden death playoff.

600.45 In case more than two teams or individuals tie for first or if two or more tie for second, a sudden death hole by hole play-off shall immediately follow after the conclusion of the District Tournament. (Team play will consist of 5 players from each school team that tied. All 5 players will play and the best 4 scores will be counted. The team that has the lowest score on the first play-off hole will be determined as the winner of the sudden death play-off).

600.46 The individual medalist will be determined by the same procedure as used in determining team championship.

600.5 **RULES**

600.51 **Scoring Rules**

600.52 U.S.G.A. scoring rules will apply in district competition. Each foursome which completes eighteen holes will report to a designated table where score cards will be checked and verified by each player in a foursome under the direction of a coach. After consultation by each player the score indicated on the card will stand. Only nine holes scores and eighteen holes scores will be posted and recorded.

600.53 Players may play practice rounds at the district site at any time, **as long as they do not miss any school to do so.** Practice rounds on Sundays must not involve a coach or school official. In addition, coaches will only be allowed to participate in team practices at the host course during Abilene ISD Invitational Tournaments, the one District Preview Tournament held in March, and the official District Tournament in April.

A distance measuring device may be used, provided it only measures distance and not factors such as slope, wind speed, etc. After a player hits two consecutive shots into a hazard, his next shot will be played from a designated drop area between the hazard and the green if permitted by the tournament director. **A player shall pick up the ball and record a score of 9 after the 8th stroke on a hole. A score of 9 is the maximum a player can receive on a hole, including all penalty strokes.**

700.32 Workers at the Sub-Varsity matches can be student managers, students, or players. This includes the scorer, clock, Libero Tracker and the line judges. Line judges **MUST** be provided for sub-varsity games

700.4 SCHEDULE

700.41 The District Executive will adopt a double round robin schedule with home sites reversed for the second year. The schedule will allow time for the playoff ties.

700.5 DAY AND TIME OF GAMES

700.51 District volleyball games will be played on **Tuesday and Fridays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. 900.103 The meet secretary will be paid \$150.00 for setting up the meet, preparing the heat sheets, running the office, keeping the records, scoring and awarding the meet, and preparing the final results.

900.104 Out-of-town officials (over 100 miles) will have their lodging and meals paid for.

900.11 CHAMPIONSHIP

900.111 District Championship

900.112 The District Champion, in both boys and girls events will be determined by point totals at the District Meet.

900.12 ADMISSION

900.121 If the host school chooses to charge admission at the finals of the District Meet, the charge will be: **Adults \$5.00 and Students \$3.00**

900.122 Gate receipts and entry fees will be used to defer the cost of the District Meet.

900.123 A financial statement will be prepared and included in the District Chairman's annual financial statement.

900.13 AWARDS

1000.72 District Chairman will set the time of the meeting and the All District meeting will be held in Wollforth, Frenship ISD.

1000.73 The following superlative categories will be voted on by the district coaches.

- A. Overall District MVP
- B. Offensive MVP
- C. Defensive MVP
- D. Midfielder of the Year
- E. Goalkeeper of the Year
- F. Newcomer of the Year
- G. District Coach of the Year.

1000.8 **ELIGIBILITY**

1000.81 **Rosters:** Each school shall submit a copy of its eligibility roster to the District Chairman prior to playing its first Contest. A copy of the eligibility roster will also be kept on file at each school.

1000.82 Supplementary eligibility lists shall be submitted to the District Chairman as players are added to the team. A copy of the supplemental eligibility roster will also be kept on file at each school.

1000.83 Only players who have remaining eligibility will be permitted to participate on Sub-varsity teams

1000.84 **Eligibility Cases:** Cases involving questions of eligibility of players should be presented in writing to the District Chairman. Coaches should make sure that the proper UIL form is used and should assist the athlete and his parents in filling out the form.

1000.85 The District will adhere to the UIL Transfer Rule with eligibility approved depending upon the filing of signed release forms with the District Chairman.

1000.9 **DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP**

1000.91 The district champion will be determined by playing a double round robin schedule.

1000.92 The team with the highest overall points will be the district champion. The team with the second highest overall points will be the district runner-up. The team with the third highest overall points will be third place and the team with the fourth highest overall points will be fourth place.

1000.93 A point system will be used in determining standings. Ties during regulation play will go straight to a penalty shoot-out. Points are given as follows

Three Points will be given to the team that wins during regulation time. The loser of the match will receive zero points.

One point guaranteed for each team for a game ending in a tie during regulation play.

Two Points will be awarded to the winner of the shootout after regulation play.

1000.94 The Tie-Breaking system

1. Teams tied for first place at the end of regular season will be co-champions, tri-champs, etc. If two teams tie for first then the higher seed for the State Tournament will be decided by the team with the most points during head to head matches. The team with the higher point total from District head to head play team will receive the higher seed.

2. If two teams tie for second or third place, the team with the higher point total from District head to head play will receive the higher district placement and the higher seed in the State Tournament.

3. If two teams tie for 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place and the higher seed cannot be determined through head to head district points the two teams will flip a coin and the winner of the flip will be awarded the higher seed. (No play-in games are permitted in District 2-6A)

4. If two teams tie for fourth, the team with the higher point total from head to head district play will be the fourth place seed. If two teams are tied for fourth and they are tied in points from their head to head games, then the two teams shall have a one game play-in game and the winner shall be designated 4th place and will be awarded the 4th seed in the playoffs.

5. In the event of multiple ties for any place, and a team or teams must be eliminated leaving only four teams, then look at head to head games. The team with the higher point total in head to head district games will receive the higher seed. If there are only two teams tied after head to head results, the follow the seeding procedures from the above sections. If there are still multiple ties after the head to head points then use the following procedures.

Three Way Tie: Determine the highest seed by a draw. The remaining two teams shall a play-in game. The winner of this game shall be designated the higher seed; the losing team shall be the lower seed.

Four-Way Tie: Determine the first round of playoff by a draw. The two winners of the first round shall have a one game playoff to determine the first and second seeds. The losers of the first round games shall have a one game playoff to determine the third and fourth seed.

Five-Way Tie: In the event of a five-way tie for any place, a draw shall be used to eliminate one team and the policy for a four-way tie shall be used.

1000.10 FIELD POLICIES

1000.101 Signs on the Field: No temporary signs shall be permitted on the field for soccer games. One permanent sign made of durable material (and positive in nature) may be displayed inside the stadium. No tape can be used to attach the sign to any object.

1000.102 Lines on the Field: No lines are to be formed by students or adults as teams come on to the field.

1000.103 Mascots: No live mascots will be permitted at soccer games.

1000.104 **Bands:** Bands may play only before the start of the contest and at half time.

1000.105 **Noise Makers:** Noisemakers such as explosives, victory bells, air horns, whistles, are any other device that might interfere with the game and distract the players are not allowed in the stadium.

1000.106 **Ball Retrievers :** If ball retrievers are used during a match there must be a minimum of two (one on each side of the field or behind goals). If the game starts with ball retrievers they must stay for the duration of the match.

1000.107 **PLAYER MISCONDUCT POINT SYSTEM**

1000.108 All coaches must report players that received a yellow or red card to a central location with 48 hours of the previously played match. This includes both district and non-district matches. If in tournament play, the coach is allowed to send in all cards received by their players on the Sunday following the tournament.

1000.109 Pre-district player misconduct reports should be in the hands of the District Executive Committee Chairman before the first district game. As per UIL rules concerning player misconduct point system, the home team coach has the responsibility to report all point violations to his Director or Athletics. The Athletic Director would then inform the Chairman of the District 2-6A or his designee by the close of the next school day after the incident took place.

1000.110 **District Game Tie Breaker Rules**

1000.111 In the event of a tie at the end of regulation, if less than a half is played, the game will be re-scheduled and will start over from the beginning..

1000.112 **Suspended Games**

1000.112.1 When inclement weather makes a field unplayable, games are to be made up on the next playable date. Rained out games may not supersede a regularly scheduled game. Rained out games will be made in the order of the regular schedule. If the home site is not available two (2) consecutive days, the game will be played on the third date at either the home or visitors playing site. Games must be made up within seven (7) days, if possible.

1000.112.2 During an inclement weather situation in which the match is delayed more than 1 hour the following will apply.

1. If the match is still in the 1st half it will be rescheduled on the next available date from the point where it was suspended.

2. If the match has begun the 2nd half it will be ruled a complete match.

1000.112.3 The host school is responsible for determining when a game is to be postponed because of inclement weather or an unplayable surface. The decision must be made by 12:00 PM and visiting teams and officials must be notified.

1000.114.1 Both male and female teams shall determine champions on a point system.

1000.114.2 The Teams with the highest point total at the end of the season will be declared champions. Second highest points runner-up, third highest points third and fourth highest points fourth place

1000.115 DETERMING PLAY-OFF POSITIONS

1000.115.1 Compare points earned.

Compare Head to Head

Compare goal differential for in district play with maximum point spread of three (3) goals

(1 point for each goal).

1000.115.2 Teams tied for the fourth and final playoff position where one team will be eliminated from the playoffs will only use head to head to determine the fourth place seed. Goal differential will no be used to determine the fourth place seed when a team can be eliminated from playoffs. If teams are tied head to head, then a play-in game will be held to determine the final playoff position.

1000.115.3 In determining goals for in district play, up to three (3) points maximum (1 point for each goal). Determine goals against in district play, up to three (3) goals. Teams tied after goal differential will play one game to determine positions. Games will consist of penalty kicks if necessary.

1100.12 The date and site of the district cross country meet will be set by the District Executive Committee at the Winter meeting each year.

1100.13 HOST ROTATION

1100.14 2016 Amarillo ISD

2017 Ector County ISD

1100.2 DATE AND TIME OF DISTRICT MEET

1100.21 The District Executive Committee shall set the date in accordance with the University Interscholastic League calendar. The time shall be determined by the host school.

1100.3 ENTRY LIMITATIONS (Teams)

1100.31 A minimum of five participants and a maximum of seven participants shall constitute a varsity team.

1100.32 Junior Varsity teams may compete and a championship may be determined.

1100.33 Teams may enter as many JV athletes as they want.

1100.34 Only the top seven (7) will be considered toward rewards.

1100.35 Top three (3) teams get smaller UIL medals than the varsity.

1100.36 Top fifteen (15) finishers get medals

1100.37 The first place boys and girls teams will be awarded a plaque.

1100.33 Entry Blanks

1100.34 Completed district entry blanks are to be sent to the District Meet Director ten (10) days prior to the district meet.

1100.4 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

1100.41 The first five finishers on each team will count for the total team score. A school may enter less than five; however, it cannot compete for the team title. A school may enter only one team of boys and one team of girls in the District Meet. The team with the lowest total score will be the Champion.

1100.5 AWARDS

1100.51 The official trophies and medals are those approved by the District Executive Committee. The host school of the District Cross Country meet will furnish the trophies and the medals for the meet. The host school will be reimbursed for the cost of the medals and the trophies out of the District 2-6A Operational Fund. Trophies and medals are to be purchased from Athletic Supply in Odessa.

1100.52 Each first place varsity team will receive a championship trophy. The top fifteen (15) finishers for men and the top fifteen (15) finishers for women will receive a medal.

1100.53 Junior varsity teams will not receive a trophy. The top five (5) finishers for men and the top five (5) finishers for women will receive a lesser quality medal than the varsity.

1100.6 RUNNING COURSE

1100.61 The running course for the District Cross Country Meet shall be determined by the host school.

1100.7 MASCOTS

1100.71 No live mascots will be permitted at the site of the District Country Meet.

1100.8 OFFICIALS

1100.81 Meet officials shall be selected by the host school.

1100.9 Distance of Races

1100.91 Varsity Boys and Girls will run 5,000 meters

SECTION 1200

2-6A TEAM TENNIS

1200.1 A coaches meeting will be on the Friday after each (Fall and Spring) state meet at 11:00 am in Wolfforth, Texas. An All-District team will be elected each time. (All of the above will be done with no cost to District 2-6A). Rule changes will be discussed.

1200.11 A first and second place team trophy will be presented at the Spring Meet. The expense of the trophies will be part of the Spring Meet and will come out of the District Operating fund.

1200.2 TEAM SCORING (DUAL MATCHES)

1200.21 A total of 19 matches, 9 boys, 9 girls, 1 mixed doubles, 10 matches to declare a match. (6 boys singles, 3 boys doubles, 6 girls singles, 3 girls doubles and 1 mixed doubles)

1200.22 INDIVIDUAL SCORING (DUAL MATCHES)

1200.23 Matches will be 2 out of 3 sets no ad scoring. If a team has 10 matches, then we will go to a 10 pt. tie breaker for the third set.

1200.3 DETERMINING DISTRICT CHAMPION

1200.31 The team having the highest percentage of district wins shall be declared the district champion. If two or more teams are tied for the district championship, the teams involved in the tie shall be declared co-champions.

1200.4 DETERMINING PLAYOFF POSITION

1200.41 Two way ties will be broken by head to head matches.

1200.42 Three way ties will be broken by the total matches won between the three schools involved in the tie.

1200.43 If still tied:

1. Total number of sets won
2. Total number of games won
3. If still tied, go to #1 positions. Team winning most matches at #1 positions will represent District as #1.
4. Continue down lineup at each position until tie is broken.
5. If matches still tied at each position, go through the positions again by sets, if still tied then games

1200.5 SUBSTITUTIONS BETWEEN DISTRICT DUAL MATCHES

1200.51 All coaches will meet the week before District play begins to vote on each school's lineup.

1200.52 Coaches will bring proposed 1-8 lineup to meeting.

1200.53 Coaches will bring all pre-district tournament results and challenge match results to defend lineup choices/doubles teams. Last year's results may also be used in this determination.

1200.54 In case of extending circumstances regarding lineups AFTER this date, a special meeting of all district coaches will be called.

1200.6 SINGLE AND DOUBLE LINE-UPS

1200.61 All positions can only change one position up or down during round-robin district play from their original line-up that was turned in at the before mentioned coaches meeting. Exceptions are limited to illness, injury and ineligibility.

1200.62 In case one of the above exceptions occurs, all positions must move up on the ladder.

1200.63 Players may move from any doubles positions to the mixed doubles positions as long as no other player has been altered more than one position up or down in any other doubles line.

1200.64 If both members of a doubles team are unable to play due to illness, injury or ineligibility, then other doubles teams will move up the ladder accordingly.

1200.65 If a player misses 1 or more matches because of illness, injury, etc., he/she must return to the line up in his former position.

1200.7 DAY AND TIME OF MATCHES

1200.71 Saturday team tennis matches will start at 11:00 am unless both coaches agree on alternate starting time. Any change in time should be reported to the Athletic Directors of the affected teams. The Athletic Director of the Home team matches should then inform all of the other schools of the change.

1200.72 District Tennis Matches will be played on **Tuesday and Saturdays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. Varsity Matches that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Matches that require a change of Date will be approved by the District Athletic Directors. Matches that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches. (Matches that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date).

1200.72 There should be a Maximum 15 minute break between doubles and singles.

1200.73 Rain delay-played at site scheduled at next available date and continued at point of suspension. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. They will then re-schedule the contest according to UIL Policy. Once the change has been scheduled, the home/host team's Athletic Director must notify all remaining District Athletic Directors, who are then responsible to notify their coaches and Principals of the changes.

1200.8 **UMPIRES**

1200.81 All schools hosting district dual meets will arrange for 1-2 USTA officials to be present during varsity matches. No USTA officials will be used if both coaches agree they are not needed.

1200.9 **RULES**

1200.91 District 2-6A has voted to use college style coaching. This means continuous coaching is acceptable as long as the flow of the match is not disrupted.

1200.92 USTA will apply. *Exception:* No default enforced if there is an unavoidable delay of arrival due to transportation difficulties.

1300.1 ADMISSIONS

1300.11 Adult Tickets shall be **\$5.00**

1300.12 Student Tickets shall be **\$3.00**

1300.2 OFFICIALS

1300.21 Officials are to be paid according to the University Interscholastic League pay schedule.

1300.22 Officials from the local chapter may be used if mutually agreeable to both coaches

1300.3 SCHEDULE

1300.31 The District Executive Committee will adopt a double round robin schedule with home sites reversed for the second year. The schedule will allow time for playoff ties.

1300.4 DAY AND TIME OF GAMES

1300.41 District Softball games will be played on **Tuesday and Saturdays**. In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. . Varsity Games that require a change of Date must be approved by the District Executive Committee. All Sub-varsity Games that require a change of Date will be approve by the District Athletic Directors of the affected teams. Games that require only a time change do not need the approval of the District Executive Committee but the District Chairman must be notified and notification will be sent out to all District administrators and coaches. (Games that require a change in date must be re-scheduled for the next available playing date).

1300.43 Saturdays: If only one field is available the Junior Varsity teams will play at 12:00 noon and the varsity teams will play at 2:00 pm. If more than one field is available then games times for both games may be at the same time.

1300.72 District Chairman will set the time of the meeting and the All District meeting will be held in Wolfforth, Texas. District Champions will host the All District Meeting.

1300.11 Cancelled Games Due To Inclement Weather

1300.111 Games cancelled due to inclement weather will be made up on the next available date.

1300.12 Suspended Games / Tied at the end of daylight

1300.121 If a game is tied or suspended the first round of district play, the game will pick up at the point of suspension and play will resume on the day of the 2nd round game versus the same opponent.

1300.122 If a game is tied or suspended the 2nd round of district play, the game will pick up at the point of suspension and play will resume the next available play date.

1400.1 DISTRICT TRACK MEET

1400.11 The District Executive Committee shall set the site and date for the District Track and Field Meet.

1400.12 The District Track meet will include 4 Divisions. Boys and Girls Varsity and Boys and Girls Junior Varsity teams.

1400.2 DIRECTOR

1400.21 The Director of the District Track and Field Meet will be the administrator in charge of athletics or designee at the member school designated by the rotation.

1400.3 HOST ROTATION

1400.31 The District Track and Field Meet will be hosted by member schools on a rotating basis as follows.

This will be a two day Meet. Varsity Pre-lims on Thursday Varsity and JV Finals on Friday

1400.4 COACHES SCRATCH MEETING

1400.41 District track and field coaches shall meet with the District Meet Director as announced during the week of the meet to make final changes and declarations and assist with setting up the meet.

1400.5 ENTRIES FOR DISTRICT MEET

1400.51 Entries for the District Track Meet are to be in the District Director's possession 5 days prior to the meet. Changes to entries will be allowed until the end of the scratch meeting. Any and all changes or additions will be accepted. Example: If a student is left off the original list, the student may be added at the scratch meeting. If an event is left un-entered, the school may enter the slot at the scratch meeting.

1400.52 Scratch Meeting on the Day of the District Track Meet: When Coaches pick up their final packets the first day of the District Meet they can make their final scratches.

1400.6 JV District Track Meet

1400.61 JV teams will have a one day meet.

1400.62 JV will run timed finals, jump 4X in long jump and triple jump and throw 4X in shot put and Discus. .

1400.63 Medals will be awarded for the top three (3) places.

1400.64 Plaques will be awarded to the JV Girls Champions and the JV Boys Champions

SECTION 1500 SPRING TENNIS TOURNAMENT

1500.1 DISTRICT TOURNAMENT

1500.11 The District Executive Committee shall set the site and date for the District Spring Tennis Tournament.

1500.12 The District coaches shall set the site and date for the District Spring Junior Varsity Tennis Tournament.

1500.2 Director

1500.21 The Director of the Spring Tennis Tournament shall be the administrator in charge of Athletics or designee at the member school designated by the rotation.

1500.3 Host Rotation

1500.31 **2017: Midland ISD 2018: San Angelo ISD**

1500.32 Certification for entry into the District Meet shall be by school and by individual. Due at seed meeting.

1500.33 The host school will provide balls for the Meet.

1500.4 Draws

1500.41 Drawing for the district meet shall be held the night before the meet begins.

1500.42 Seeding

1500.421 Coaches should bring seeding information for each entrant that they would like seeded. Information should include the following: Fall and Spring record, tournaments, individual/dual matches and win/loss record. Seeds will be a maximum ration of one seed for every four players. Once the seeds are established, every seeded position is determined by lot (i.e. Flip a coin to see if the #1 seed goes on Line 1 or Line 16. #2 goes on the other and flip to see if #3 goes on Line 5 or Line 12; then #4 goes on the remaining line). After the seeded players (and byes if applicable) have been written in, fill in the rest of the draw by drawing names of the remaining players and putting them on the unoccupied lines in the order in which they are drawn, starting at the top and moving downward in sequence. If two players from the same school come up with numbers in the same half, the second player will go to the first open line of the bottom half.

1500.5 Scoring

1500.51 Matches will be two out of three sets, add scoring, and a 7-12 point tie breaker being played at 6-all sets.

1500.6 **Rules**

1500.61 District 2-6A has voted to use college-style coaching. This means continuous coaching is acceptable as long as the flow of the match is not disrupted.

1500.62 USTA will apply. *Exception:* No default enforced if there is an unavoidable delay of arrival due to transportation difficulties.

1500.7 **Number of Matches**

1500.71 No contestant or team shall play more than three matches per day and there shall be a minimum of one hour's rest for a team or player between the close of one match and the beginning of another.

1500.91 The loser in the finals will play the winner of the third place match (to determine second place) unless these two contestants (or doubles teams) played each other in the semi-finals.

1500.92 The finals and the consolation matches will start at the same time.

1500.100 **Officials – District Tournament**

1500.101 Home District School is responsible for officials.

1500.200 **Coaches Meeting**

1500.201 A coaches meeting will be held on Friday after each (Fall and Spring) State Meet. An All-District team shall be elected each time and rules and rule changes shall be discussed. (All of the above will be done at no cost to the District). Rule and Policy changes should be submitted to the District Athletic Directors for Discussion and to the District Executive Committee for approval.

1500.202 District Champions will set the time of the meeting and the All District meeting will be held in Wolfforth, Texas. All District Tennis Coaches must be present at the All District Meeting before a vote can be taken

1600.21 The District Championship Meet will determine the District Championships for both the boys and girls.

1600.22 The round robin schedule (dual meets) will determine the order of rotations for the District Championship Meet. See the chart rotation below. (The district entry form needs a win/loss record space added).

1600.23 The Girls rotation is set for two panels of judges, two events at a time.

The Boys rotation is set for three panels of judges, three events at a time.

1600.24 The #1 equals the first place teams and #2 equals the second place teams etc. from the round robin competition.

1600.25 Should there be a tie: **First tiebreaker:** the team that won the dual meet between the two teams that tied will get the higher seed. **Second tiebreaker:** The average of optional scores in district dual meets added to the average compulsory score of district dual meets will be used to break the tie.

1600.26 The rotation format for compulsory and optional will be the same. The team in first place after the compulsories will compete in the #1 position the second day.

1600.31 Entry fee for the District Championship Meet is \$200 per team (for each boy's and girl's team). Make checks payable to the school district of the host meet director. Financial responsibility for this meet does not come out of the District 2-6A Operational Budget.

1600.32 JUDGES FOR THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP MEET

1600.32 The Regional Assigning Director will assign judges for the District 2-6A Meet.

1600.33 Men's Judges: A poll of judges will be taken by the men's coaches and sent to the meet host at least one week before G.A.T. The Regional Assigning Director, will then contact the judges on the approved list in a timely manner.

1600.34 Women's Judges: The Regional Assigning Director, keeping state judging assignments will assign the women's judges.

1600.5 **AWARDS**

1600.51 Trophies will be awarded to the top boys' teams and the top girls' teams. All-around medals will be awarded to the first through sixth place. Individual event medals will be awarded to first through sixth.

1600.52 The official district medal adopted by the coaches in 1995 will be used. Butler Trophies in Abilene, Texas hold the mold to this medal. 325-672-7199.

1600.6 **ALL-DISTRICT TEAM**

1600.61 The "All District Team" will be announced during awards ceremony at the District Championships. The top three in each event plus the all-around shall be the All-District first team. Places four thru six in each event plus the all-around shall be the All-District second team.

1600.62 The All-District Honorable Mention team will be nominated, voted on and announced by the coaches at the District Championships. Nominations will be discussed during coaches meeting on the second day of competition. Each coach can nominate two gymnasts. The All-District honorable mention team will consist of a maximum of six boys and six girls.

1600.7 **ADVANCEMENT TO THE REGIONAL MEET**

1600.71 Advancement to the regional meet will be based on the following:

A. All District 3-6A teams will advance to compete in the Regional Championships

B. If your team does not qualify then the top three Girls and Boys from each event and All-around will advance to Regional Meet

1600.72 The team score for the men will be 250 instead of 305 and the women 180 instead of 215.

1600.73 Individuals and All-Around may qualify by event even if their team does not qualify.

1600.74 A coach may petition a gymnast to the regional meet by following the guidelines set forth in the state THSGCA Constitution and Manual of Rules. The petition must be submitted to the host school of the District Championship Meet at the said meet.

1600.8 **DISTRICT DUAL MEETS**

1600.81 Refer to the above schedule.

1600.82 The adopted dual meet schedule attached does not determine the boys and girls championships. The results of these five (5) dual meets will determine the order of rotations for the District Championship Meet. (900.22)

1600.83 In the event of a conflict that jeopardizes a regularly scheduled contest, the Athletic Directors of the affected teams must agree that a change is necessary. They will then re-schedule the contest according to UIL policy. Once the change has been scheduled, the home/host team's Athletic Director must notify all remaining District Athletic Directors, who are then responsible to notify their coaches and Superintendents of the change.

1600.84 Meet sites will be reversed each year.

1600.85 Exercise (compulsory and optional) will be reversed on odd numbered years.

1600.86 Meet make-ups will be scheduled as soon as possible.

1600.87 The meet host will provide a minimum of two-hour warm up time prior to competition. **Saturday Meet:** Warm-up at 11:00 A.M., meet at 1:00 P.M. **Friday Meet:** Warm-up at 3:00 P.M., meet at 5:00 P.M.

1600.88 Two judges (2 men's and 2 women's) will be provided by the host school.

1600.89 The THSGCA manual, page 19, section 1, #6, will be the guidelines for using judges and officials. In all gymnastic meets, there shall be at least two (2) judges, one (1) judge may be used provided he/she is approved by the visiting head coach. The Association recommends that judges from the **Texas Gymnastics Judges Association** for men and **National Association of Women's Gymnastics Judges** for women be used.

1600.891 The meet host must notify the visiting school one week in advance if the host school cannot obtain two (2) rated judges for each the men's and women's competition.

1600.892 Relatives of the participants cannot judge.

1600.893 Judges must have been out of school two (2) gymnastic seasons before judging meets involving the school in which they attended.

1600.9 **ADMISSION**

1600.91 No admission fees will be charged for dual meets.

1600.92 Admission fees for the District Championship Meet will be as follows:

Adult tickets shall be \$5.00 per day

Student tickets shall be \$3.00 per day.

1600.100 **ELIGIBILITY**

1600.101 UIL standards will apply to all academic eligibility

1600.200 **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1600.201 District schools participating in gymnastics will adhere to the rules and regulations as established by the **Texas High School Gymnastics Association**.

1600.300 **GYMNASIUM POLICIES**

1600.301 No temporary signs shall be permitted in the gyms during gymnastic events. Permanent signs are permitted. No Tape can be use to attach signs to any surface.

1600.302 Live mascots will not be permitted at gymnastics events.

1600.303 No lines are to be formed by students or adults as team come on to the gym floor.

1600.304 Noisemakers such as explosives, victory bells, air horns, whistles, etc. are not allowed in the gymnasiums during gymnastic meets.

1600.305 School Bands may play only before the start of the meet.

1600.400 **DISTRICT COACHES MEETING**

1600.401 The coach of the District Championship team (boys on even and girls on odd years) will host the district coaches meeting within three weeks of the state meet. (The meeting will be held in Wolfforth, Texas).

1600.402 The purpose of this meeting is:

- A. To review the rules for changes, additions or up-dates.
- B. To discuss the gymnastics schedule for the next season.
- C. Discuss ways to better meet the needs of our gymnasts.
- D. Recommendations for the summer GAT meeting.
- E. Announcement of the All District Team.
- F. Vote on and announce the All-District Second Team.
