(adjust your voice to reflect the story) Now you try it.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Comprehension</li> <li>Searches for information to confirm predictions</li> <li>Identifies important ideas in the text</li> <li>Notices descriptive language</li> <li>Summarizes the text</li> <li>Describes characters' traits, feelings, and motivation. Uses this information to make predictions</li> <li>Demonstrates changes in perspective as events unfold</li> <li>Pays attention to the author's craft</li> <li>Expresses clear opinions to agree or disagree with the text</li> <li>Rereads and closely monitors their understanding</li> <li>Uses a variety of strategies when meaning breaks down</li> <li>Starts to identify when and if characters change</li> <li>Uses the organization of the text to support understanding</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Comprehension</li> <li>Summarize the story or text</li> <li>Describe (character's name) in detail.</li> <li>What happened? Why did it happen?</li> <li>What in the story makes you think that?</li> <li>What caused (problem or event) to happen? How do you know?</li> <li>What do you think (character's name) will do? Why?</li> <li>How has (character's name) changed?</li> <li>What is important for me to know in this text? Why?</li> <li>How does the author help to create a picture in your mind as you read?</li> <li>What do think about this text?</li> <li>How do you know when you do not understand what you are reading? What do you do?</li> <li>How did the author organize this text?</li> </ul>
