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Due to COVID-19, Midland ISD has decided to implement the re-entry plan of virtual learning for the first four weeks of school. However, Sam Houston Collegiate Preparatory School will attend classes on site. Child Nutrition Services (CNS) will continue to provide meals for students through the cafeteria. In the instance that your child attends virtual learning, there will be Grab and Go sites available (see list attached).

Application Information: Effective 8/05/2020, CNS will operate under the National School Lunch Program guidelines. Students who were qualified as free or reduced eligibility status last school year will **remain free or reduced until 9/18/2020**. If an application has not been completed and processed by 9/18/2020, the **student's eligibility will change to paid status**.

Where to Find Applications: The meal application is available on the Child Nutrition Services tab on the Midland ISD website. Paper applications are available at all MISD campuses and the CNS office located at 801 S Moran St Bldg. 2, Midland, TX.

Meal Payment: Lunch meals may be paid for by depositing money into student's existing SchoolCafe account or with cash at the Grab and Go sites. SchoolCafe is located on the CNS tab under Pre-Payment Options at the top of the page. The SchoolCafe can also be downloaded as an app. **Breakfast meals are free to all students.**

Grab and Go Information: The bar-code at the top of this letter will be used to identify the student at the Grab and Go site. **The bar-code is required** when picking up a meal for your student. Parents may pick up meals for their child with this letter without their child being present. Each student will only receive 1 breakfast and 1 lunch a day.
